December 10: **A Child's Christmas in Wales** by Dylan Thomas - In print for fifty years, this gem of lyric prose has enchanted both young and old from its very first edition. Dylan Thomas, one of the greatest poets and storytellers of the twentieth century, captures a child's-eye view, and an adult's fond memories, of a magical time of presents, aunts and uncles, the frozen sea, and in the best of circumstances, newly fallen snow.

January 14, 2015: **The Swan Thieves** by Elizabeth Kostova - Kostova's masterful new novel travels from American cities to the coast of Normandy, from the late 19th century to the late 20th, from young love to last love, to create a story of obsession, history's losses, and the power of art to preserve human hope.

February 11, 2015: **The Alchemist** by Paulo Coelho - This story, dazzling in its powerful simplicity and inspiring wisdom, is about an Andalusian shepherd boy named Santiago who travels from his homeland in Spain to the Egyptian desert in search of a treasure buried in the Pyramids. Lush, evocative, and deeply humane, the story of Santiago is an eternal testament to the transforming power of our dreams and the importance of listening to our hearts.

March 11, 2015: **Up Country** by Nelson MeMille Retired army homicide investigator Paul Brenner is asked by his former commanding officer to investigate a murder that took place in wartime Vietnam. Back in Vietnam, Brenner is plunged into a world of corruption and thrust back into a war that never ended.

April 8, 2015: **The Storied Life** of A. J. Fikry by Gabrielle Zevin – An unexpected occurrence gives Firkey the chance to make his life over and see things anew.





Community Connections

Saturday, November 15, 2014



AAUW is committed to leadership development for girls and women and the St. Lawrence County Branch is designing a new leadership development institute for young women in the Canton-Potsdam area. Utilizing local women leaders, AAUW intends to provide mentors and leadership education opportunities to students from the

Associated Colleges of the St.
Lawrence Valley (ACSLV) on an ongoing basis, with occasional conferences on topics of concern.
Over time, an additional goal is to train and encourage the college students to mentor and support younger girls in the community. This initiative is meant to support young female leaders by providing participants with leadership skill training, enterprise development, networking opportunities, and mentoring relationships.

On November 15th, 2014, a "Community Connections" conference on the St Lawrence University Campus will bring together students from the four colleges and women leaders from the community to discuss women's leadership, initiate mentoring relationships, and offer additional insights about potential programming. It is expected that 100 to 120 students will participate in the conference along with 25-30 women leaders. The conference is supported with funding from the Associated Colleges of the St Lawrence Valley and the AAUW. Speakers for the event are **Dr. Dayle Smith**, Dean of the School of Business at Clarkson University and **Dr. Kristin Esterberg**, President of SUNY Potsdam.

The opening talk by Dr. Smith will be followed by lunch and discussion with women leaders from the

community who will serve as table hosts. A cross section of political, business, academic, non-profit leaders have been invited. Information garnered in spring 2014 student focus groups will be used by the organizers to create a discussion agenda for the tables. A dessert reception after the luncheon and Dr. Esterberg's remarks will allow attendees to

meet attending community leaders who were not hosts at their table, increasing the possibilities for networking.

The organizers plan to follow up the conference with other events and workshops in the spring. A website will also be unveiled shortly after the conference where attendees and others interested in encouraging women's leadership will be able to find information about the local follow-up

activities, future conference plans, and links to other relevant sites.

24th annual 16 Days of Activism Against Gender Violence Campaign From Peace in the Home to Peace in the World: Let's Challenge Militarism and End Gender-Based Violence!

Positioning the 16 Days Campaign from November 25 (International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women) and December 10 (Human Rights Day) rightfully stresses that gender-based violence is an international human rights violation. In the lead up to, and during, the 16 days of activism, participants will highlight the systemic nature of gender-based violence and militarism which encourages inequality and discrimination and prioritizes weapons spending over funding for quality education and healthcare and safe public spaces.



The culture of militarism builds on and protects systems of power by controlling dissent and using violence to settle economic, political and social disputes. Militarism draws on and perpetuates patriarchal models of political, economic, and social domination of people by a small number of elites and privileges violent masculinity as acceptable behavior.

The 16 Days Campaign focus on the intersections of gender-based violence and militarism is an effort to work toward a more equitable and peaceful world. In a global effort, thousands of organizations are working in 172 countries to raise awareness about the pervasiveness of the multiple forms of violence women face. Constance A. Morella served as Ambassador to the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) from 2003-2007 and is the first United States Ambassador to the OECD ever to have served in the United States Congress. From 1987 until 2003, Morella represented Maryland's 8th Congressional District where she developed a national reputation as a leading advocate for women, children, and families.

During her sixteen years in the House of Representatives, Morella was a leader in efforts to promote economic growth through science and technology, serving as a member of the House Committee on Science and



chairing the Subcommittee on Technology. A strong supporter of economic growth through free trade, Morella advocated for liberalized trade rules and heightened international engagement. She chaired the Congressional Caucus for Women's Issues, advancing efforts to promote access to micro-enterprise capital among women in developing countries.

On her watch as Ambassador to OECD, she was a key participant in the negotiations and agreements leading to a strategy of enlargement to include five potential country members: Chile, Estonia, Israel, Russia, and Slovenia. She also advanced the program to engage with the rapidly developing countries of Brazil, India, Indonesia, China, and South Africa as well as the Southeast Asia region.

She is on the board of the Franklin Center for Global Policy Exchange, Institute for Representative Government, Cafritz Foundation Advisory Board, and the Washington Institute of Foreign Affairs. She was appointed by President Obama in 2010 to the American Battle Monuments Commission. In 2009, she was appointed Ambassador in Residence at American University School of Public Affairs where she teaches "Women, Politics, and Public Policy."
